

Stall 1 – gray roan mare EASY TO HANDLE	12' Aisle with pair of hinged doors	Stall 5 – large gelding Black with white spots HERD LEADER - EASY TO HANDLE
Stall 2 – small brown mare – EASY TO HANDLE		Stall 6 – sorrel (red) gelding – EASY TO HANDLE
Stall 3 - black mare with “snowflake” pattern on rump EASY TO HANDLE		Stall 7/8 – removable center boards to make 2 stalls – currently has red roan mare and sorrel colt with white blanket at side MARE MAY BE HARD TO HANDLE – COLT MUST BE KEPT WITHIN SIGHT OF MARE
Stall 4 – filly, 2 years, Sorrel/white blanket MAY NEED HELP TO EVACUATE

If horses are changed around from stall to stall (or new horses come in and others leave frequently) you may want to merely number the stalls and attach an explanation sheet when stall assignments change. To keep things simple, it can be helpful to keep similar types of horses in each of the stalls so you don't have to keep revising your list.
